Finding the Big Dipper, the North Star, and the Little Dipper

Use this aid for **Bear Elective 1: Space – Requirement a**: Identify two constellations and the North Star in the night sky.

- 1. To locate the Big Dipper, look in the north sky.
- 2. Look for a constellation that looks like a big ladle. See the picture below for an example, but be aware that the orientation of the constellation might be different than shown in the picture.
- 3. Imagine a line from the two stars at the end of the "bowl" of the Big Dipper.
- 4. Follow that line to find the bright star at the end of the handle of the Little Dipper.
- 5. That star is the North Star. The North Star always points to true north.
